Grant Summaries

Environmental Asset Management and Greenhouse Gas Inventory

The City of Kingston will hire an Environmental Asset Manager to design, develop and implement a municipal fleet management program and to update the existing 2010 Greenhouse Gas Emissions (GHG) Inventory. This will enable the City to track energy use and guide its achievement of energy reduction goals established by the Climate Action Plan in 2012.

Grant Award: \$50,000

Rondout Riverport Shoreline Stabilization and Public Access Design

The City of Kingston will design improvements along Kingston's waterfront area. The project will involve the design of sustainable shoreline stabilization and restoration and a promenade to increase public access along the waterfront, flooding resiliency, and boating activity.

Funding Source: NYS Department of State

Grant Award: \$197,500

Kingston Point Park Infrastructure Improvements

Added amenities to the Kingston Point Park Complex, including an eventual installation of a soccer field, improvement of drainage and access to existing parking lot, and improvement of the Kingston Point Dog Park. Energy efficient lighting will also be installed.

Funding Source: Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation

Grant Award: \$300,000

Kingston Point Rail Trail Enhancements

The City of Kingston will construct trailheads on 1.5 miles of former railroad linear right of way in the City. The project will also include surfacing of a portion of the rail trail, which will bring the end point of the trail to the waterfront next to the Trolley Museum on East Strand Street.

Funding Source: Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation

Grant Award: \$500,000

Broadway Clean and Green Streetscape

The City of Kingston will rehabilitate sidewalks and install a two-way protected bike lane and synchronized traffic and bike signals, improved bus stops, and streetscape amenities on a 3,200-foot stretch of Broadway between St. James Street and Grand Street in the Midtown neighborhood. These funds will support the Broadway Streetscape Project, for which prior funding has been secured and the design is underway.

Funding Source: NYS DEC Climate Smart Communities Grant

Grant Award: \$850,000

Broadway Clean and Green Streetscape

The City of Kingston will install porous pavers, bioswales and street tree pits along Broadway. . This project will help to reduce the amount of stormwater flowing into the City's combined sewer system while demonstrating the benefits of green infrastructure on a highly visible main thoroughfare of Kingston.
