Dear Mayor Noble:

Attached is a copy of the Henry Street Bluestone Sidewalk survey, which we conducted in response to the city's plan to replace the sidewalks with concrete, along with a summary of the findings and our methodology. We were amazed at the wealth of intact bluestone infrastructure, including a limestone hitching post and carriage steps, still in place after some 140 years. The western section of Henry Street is as rich in historic resources as any of Kingston's historic districts.

Because the street is level, the bluestone sidewalks do not present the kind of hazards that exist elsewhere in the city. In a few sections, seams of cement had been applied between the slabs, evidence of property owners' care in preserving these sidewalks. Anecdotally, we met several residents and owners of the properties, all of whom expressed their appreciation for the bluestone.

The city itself has recognized the historic significance of this section of Henry Street. In its 1989 Resolution for the Local Historic Designation of the Fair Street Historic District, the Common Council defined the southern end of the district as extending to Henry Street, not Franklin, as has been widely believed. (See the attached map.) We believe this means the city is required to preserve that section of bluestone sidewalk. Logic would dictate that the entire area of extant bluestone be protected at least to Pine Street, as was planned for the Franklin Street sidewalk replacement project (although there is a stretch of 35 contiguous intact slabs running west from Clinton that is worthy of preservation).

Furthermore, a tiny section of Henry Street off Fair is included in the Heritage Area because of its importance in the 19<sup>th</sup>-century transportation of bluestone to the docks in Wilbur. Bluestone was once a major industry in Kingston, which made and lost fortunes (the middlemen who purchased the quarries have been compared to oil wildcatters), providing employment for thousands; the valuable stone was exported by the ton to cities throughout the country. The North River bluestone, as

the local stone was called, was considered the hardest and most valuable on earth. Some of the horse-drawn wagonloads were so heavy they damaged the streets, leading to the construction of parallel bluestone tracks between West Hurley and Wilbur. (For more information on bluestone and fascinating details of its history, see Robert P. Donaldson's *Chronicles of Ulster*.)

In yet another acknowledgement of the historic significance of Henry Street and its environs, the "Midtown West Intensive-Level Cultural Resources Survey," which was commissioned by the city's Office of Planning and HLPC in 2003 and inventoried 208 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup>-century buildings, proposed creating a National Register historic district for the area. (See the second attached map.)

Lynn's postings on Facebook in early April expressing our concerns about Henry Street's threatened bluestone generated an overwhelmingly positive response, indicating strong support for preservation. Comments noted how preserving our existing bluestone is also a green initiative, in contrast with pouring new concrete, one of the world's worse carbon offenders.

We appreciate the city's awareness of this issue as evidenced by its plans to hold a meeting soon to discuss the bluestone sidewalks on Henry Street. Cost has been cited as a major impediment to preserving them, but in our opinion this is shortsighted. Kingston is one of the nation's most historic cities and its prosperity is deeply rooted in the preservation of existing historic resources. Indeed, much of the money invested in the city in recent years has been attracted to, and capitalized on, those resources.

In a handwritten note, our beloved late Ed Ford listed ten of his favorite things. Number eight was bluestone, and we dedicate this survey to his memory. We appreciate your consideration of this important matter.

## **Survey of Henry Street bluestone sidewalks**

Conducted 3/30/21 by Lynn Woods and David Weseley

We counted each stone between Clinton and Fair streets on sidewalks on both the north and south sides of the street and indicated whether the condition was intact, 90% intact, 50-90% intact, or less than 50% intact; whether they aligned vertically 1/4<sup>th</sup> inch or less; and whether the horizontal space between the stones was 1/4<sup>th</sup> inch or less. We also noted whether there were other bluestone features, such as walkways, steps, retaining walls, edging and the like contiguous or very nearly so to each slab.

Compared to the professional-grade inventories undertaken for the Bluestone Survey of 2013, our methods were crude, confined to our eyes and a measuring stick, yet we think our findings are nonetheless valuable in that they show the substantial amount of historic bluestone sidewalk that survives.

Here are the significant findings:

Between Clinton and Fair, there are a total of 404 flags, of which 198 bluestone flags are on the south sidewalk and 206 are on the north sidewalk.

Of those, a total of 262 are intact or nearly intact—well over half. On the south sidewalk 122 flags are intact or nearly so and on the north side, 140 flags.

Many of the slabs that are 50-90 percent intact contain just one, two or three large cracks and look like they could be easily repaired.

Most of the flags are five feet wide—all on the north sidewalk--and some are partially buried in dirt along the edge. On the south sidewalk, none were uplifted to the point of being a serious hazard. Here are the groupings of contiguous stones (i.e., 5 means there is an unbroken section of five contiguous flags):

On south sidewalk, contiguous sections are as follows: 22, 15, 15, 5, 4, 2, 5 (a few others following this number are similarly broken up; I didn't document all of them), 11, 27, 57.

On north sidewalk, contiguous sections are as follows: 26, 58, 20, 7, 9, 7, 3, 12, 4, 26.

Comments:

A total of 45 flags are contiguous to stones that lead to the curb or stairway or porch to the adjacent house. One hundred thirty-eight flags are complemented by a bluestone feature, such as a retaining wall.

One of the most intact sections of bluestone sidewalk is on the south sidewalk extending from Clinton Avenue toward Schryver. There are 35 slabs, all intact except for one, which is nearly intact, of solid bluestone, in beautiful condition and


fairly level, which abut a grassy strip backed by a restored mortared bluestone retaining wall. The corner house has a restored Victorian porch and brackets that complete the picture of historic harmony. The property owner also planted two trees on the grass strip abutting the street, which, like the entire street, has bluestone curbs.

On the north sidewalk between Pine and Fair, there are four intact stones measuring five by five feet.

In the block between Fair and Pine, there is a carved limestone hitching post, a bluestone carriage stoop and, leading up to the house that's adjacent, a carved circular bluestone step to a set of bluestone stairs. Although there are sections where the sidewalk has been destroyed by asphalt—one section of the block contains a rough retaining-type earthwork studded with broken bluestone pieces—there are also numerous intact sections in good condition. And because there are no large trees on this portion of the street and the street is level, most of the bluestone is safely navigable.

A critical factor in historic preservation is the integrity of the asset. The bluestone sidewalks are part of a mostly intact infrastructure that includes bluestone stairs and stair bases, retaining walls and bluestone borders of various types and styles, and paths leading to a porch or entrance. This infrastructure will be greatly compromised—diminished into fragments—if the bluestone sidewalks are replaced with concrete.


The city code itself addresses the importance of preserving its remaining bluestone sidewalks and includes instructions on how to make repairs. The city also obtained funding for a 2013 Bluestone Survey, which advocated for bluestone sidewalk preservation citywide. Besides Fair Street, Henry Street intersects with mostly intact bluestone sidewalks on Pine (east sidewalk), Oak, and Clinton (west sidewalk). This area is very rich in bluestone resources and its preservation should be considered as a whole.
