I would like to request an agenda item for placement on the Finance Committee agenda for February. The City was recently awarded a \$3,343,345 grant for Kingston Point Beach swimming facility upgrades through the New York Statewide Investment in More Swimming (NY SWIMS) initiative. In the Fall, the Common Council adopted Resolution #189 of 2024 which authorized the expenditure of the funds and also set up a capital account for the cost of the project and the match.

Since that time, during the contract negotiations, the funder requested an updated estimate for the project from our contractor and that estimate came in higher than the 2020 estimate. This difference has changed the full project cost from the original \$4,179,181 to \$4,326,079. To cover those costs, I will need approval of an additional match funding of \$253,892 to total a committed match of \$1,089,728.00 for this project. The funder is requesting a modified resolution reflecting this.

I would like to request the following for placement on the Finance Committee agenda for February: The City was recently awarded \$30,000 from NYSERDA's Clean Energy Communities Program for completion of the Clean Heating and Cooling Tier 3 Action, and in continued recognition of the 30 High Impact Actions we have completed towards the state's energy goals. This money is going to be used towards the installation of a 18kW roof mount solar system on the Hasbrouck Park Pavilion.

Additionally, my office applied for a new ARPA grant offered through Ulster County in July of 2024, ARP Solar and EV Charging Infrastructure Grant (SEVI) and were successful in a \$40,000 award, also to be used towards the Hasbrouck Park Pavilion Solar Project.

The estimated total cost for the Project is \$84,285, based on the most recent solar contracts the City has engaged in and includes tree trimming, electrical upgrades and meter fees and pavilion reinforcement.

I respectfully request a budget modification for carryovers from two of the 2024 budget accounts to two of the 2025 budget accounts.

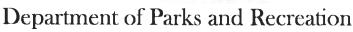

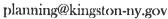

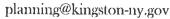
