THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER BY PRESIDENT NOBLE WITH THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE AND A MOMENT OF SILENCE.

A MOTION TO DISPENSE WITH THE READING OF THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING AND APPROVE SAME AS PREPARED AND FILED BY THE CITY CLERK WAS OFFERED BY ALDERMAN SCOTT-CHILDRESS, SECONDED BY ALDERMAN DAVIS. CARRIED ON ROLL CALL BY VOICE 8-0.

A MOTION TO DISPENSE WITH THE READING OF THE GENERAL BILLS WAS OFFERED BY ALDERMAN SCHABOT, SECONDED BY ALDERMAN WORTHINGTON. CARRIED ON ROLL CALL BY VOICE 8-0.

PUBLIC SPEAKING: 30 MINUTE ALLOTMENT

1. PAULA WISNESKI, 43 SHEEHAN COURT. SHE IS A DAILY RIDER OF THE KINGSTON CITY BUS TO GET TO WORK. SHE URGES ALDERMEN TO VOTE NO ON THE MERGER WITH UCAT. SHE STATES THAT THE NEW BUSES WILL NOT GO INTO ANY OF THE HOUSING PROJECTS, WHICH WILL MAKE IT DIFFICULT FOR THE ELDERLY AND HANDICAP TO ACCESS THE BUS. THEY WILL ONLY PICKUP OUTSIDE THE COMPLEXES. SHE HAS OFFERED THE ALDERMEN IN THE PAST TO RIDE THE BUSES WITH HER TO SEE HOW THEY OPERATE.
2. DAN PROCTOR, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF FLEET OBSOLETE, A PT BOAT RESTORATION GROUP. THE ORGANIZATION HOPES TO CAPTURE SOME MISSING CRAFTS AND SKILLS THAT ARE FADING AND BRING THE HISTORY OF PT BOAT TO THE PUBLIC. THE BOAT WAS A SIGNIFICANT VESSEL DURING WW11 THAT ENGAGED MORE TARGETS THAN ANY OTHER CRAFT IN THE NAVY. THEY HOPE THAT THE PUBLIC WILL LEARN HOW TO RESTORE THESE VESSELS BEFORE THE CRAFT IS LOST ENTIRELY.
3. BILL KNOWLES, PRESIDENT OF THE VOLUNTEER FIREMAN'S MUSEUM, LIVES AT 72 HURLEY AVENUE. HE ENCOURAGES THE PASSAGE OF THE RESOLUTION TO ALLOW MONEY TO BE USED TO FIX THE MUSEUM. THEY HAVE OVER THE YEARS HAD PEOPLE FROM ALL OVER THE WORLD VISIT.
4. JOSEPH DIFALCO, 66 GLEN ST. THE FINANCIAL STATUS OF THE CITY IS NOT ACCURATE. NOW THE CITY WANTS AN IDA WHEN THEY ALREADY HAVE KLDC THAT HAS FLOPPED. THERE IS A LOOMING DEBT THAT WILL BE DUE IN TWO YEARS. HE STATES THAT ALDERMAN SCOTT-CHILDRESS SAYS WITH AN IDA THE CITY WILL HAVE "MORE CONTROL OVER WHAT'S DONE IN THE CITY". THERE WERE MORE PEOPLE ON THE COUNTY IDA THAT OPPOSED GIVING PILOTS TO THE NEW OWNERS OF THE GOVERNOR CLINTON AND YOSMAN TOWER BUILDINGS, HOWEVER THE COUNCIL GAVE THEM A PILOT. THE COUNTY IDA MUST CONTACT THE MUNICIPALITY BEFORE PROCEEDING WITH ANY ACTION, SO FOR THE CITY TO HAVE ITS OWN IDA IS A DOUBLE LAYER OF GOVERNMENT.
5. MARYANN PARKER, BELEVEDERE ST. SHE IS OPPOSED TO CREATING A PLAYGROUND AT THE FORMER PLANET WINGS LOCATION. ACCORDING TO THE CITY SAFETY DEPARTMENT, THERE HAVE BEEN 29 ACCIDENTS TO DATE AT THAT INTERSECTION. WITH 3 LANES OF TRAFFIC. THE PROPERTY IS ASSESSED AT \$400,000 WITH AN ADDITIONAL \$25,000 COST TO DEMOLISH, IN THE PAST THE CITY WOULD OBTAIN A PROPERTY, DEMOLISH AND RESALE TO KEEP IT ON THE TAX ROLLS. THE OLD KINGS INN SITE WOULD BE MORE APPROPRIATE. THE CHILDREN FROM MIDTOWN AND THE SOON TO BE RUPCO HOUSING ON CEDAR ST. COULD USE THAT MORE EASILY AND WITH LESS WORRY OF TRAFFIC. THE OTHER ISSUE IS THAT CENTRAL HUDSON WILL BE REPLACING ALL THE GAS LINES ON DOWNS ST. FROM BROADWAY TO BELVEDERE. THERE ALREADY EXISTS A DANGEROUS SITUATION WITH THE HEAVY TRUCK TRAFFIC THAT IS USING THAT AREA AS A SHORTCUT. THERE ARE TOO MANY VEHICLES PARKED AND DRIVING THERE NOW AND THERE HAVE BEEN QUITE A FEW ACCIDENTS. THE CITY SHOULD CONSIDER THE PUBLIC SAFETY. SHE IS VERY HAPPY ABOUT THE PT BOAT RESTORATION PROJECT.
6. ELLEN DIFALCO, 66 GLEN ST. SHE IS HAPPY THAT THE COMMITTEE AND COUNCIL MEETINGS ARE BEING VIDEO TAPED FOR THE PUBLIC. THERE ARE HOWEVER 24 COMMISSIONS AND COUNTING THAT HAVEN'T POSTED ANY MINUTES SINCE 2017. OPEN MEETING LAWS STATE THAT MINUTES SHALL BE TAKEN AT EVERY MEETING AND BE POSTED WITHIN 2 WEEKS OF THAT MEETING. MANY TIMES WHEN A FOIL REQUEST IS SENT ABOUT A MEETING IT IS SENT BACK STATING THAT THIS DOESN'T EXIST. FOR MORE VIEWERSHIP THE TAPES SHOULD BY SENT TO THE TOWN OF ESOPUS TO VIEW ALL MONTH LONG ON CHANNEL 23, AS THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE DOES.
7. ROSE QUINN, 78 DOWNS ST. SHE SUPPORTS THE BUS MERGER, SHE NEVER TAKES CITIBUS SAYS THAT UCAT IS MORE EFFICIENT AND IS MORE ACCESSIBLE. WHEN SHE LOOKED AT THE CITY SCHEDULE, SHE FOUND IT VERY DIFFICULT TO FIGURE OUT.
8. MARY JALLEH, ULSTER COUNTY BOCES ADULT EDUCATION AND SPECIAL EDUCATION, SUPPORTS THE BUS MERGER. IT WILL HELP STUDENTS TO HAVE GREATER ACCESS TO TRANSPORTATION TO GET TO CLASSES ON TIME. WHICH WILL HELP THEM TO BE MORE SELF-SUFFICIENT.
9. LIAM KAHN, 56 ABRUYN ST. HE IS A NEW RESIDENT WHO IS IN FAVOR OF THE MERGER, THE CITY BUS SCHEDULE IS DIFFICULT TO UNDERSTAND. UCAT IS MORE EFFICIENT FOR COLLEGE STUDENTS. A ROBUST BUS SYSTMEN IS GOOD FOR A CITY.
