Whereas, Kingston is leading the way in upstate New York when it comes to redesigning our roadways. Working with local engineers, NYS DOT, community members and advocacy organizations, the City of Kingston has begun to literally reshape our pedestrian, bicycle and motor vehicle environments. Recently completed projects include the Broadway Streetscape Project, the Broadway Grand Intersection Realignment Project, the Franklin Street Complete Streets Project, and the Pedestrian Safety Action Plan Intersection Project, among many others; and

Whereas, with the addition of the Kingston Greenline, multiple complete street projects in various Kingston neighborhoods and a recently completed Pedestrian and Bicycle Master Plan, Kingston is taking steps to transition our streets into safer roadways. The Kingston Point Rail Trail Phase 1 (Phase 2 is under design) and the Midtown Linear Park have been created, both of which provide off-street paths and connections for walking and biking. The Kingston Greenline is a network of urban trails, complete streets, improved sidewalks, bike lanes, and linear parks in Kingston; and

Whereas, Kingston will continue to call on the federal government to continue its efforts to improve the vehicle safety system through advocacy with our federal representatives. **Declare**, Kingston will promote safer speeds in all roadway environments through a combination of thoughtful, equitable, context-appropriate roadway design, appropriate speed-limit setting, targeted education, outreach campaigns, and enforcement; and I further

**Declare,** Kingston will promote a complete, city-wide network of sidewalks that are safe and accessible for all users; and I further

Dear President Shaut,

Pursuant to the City of Kingston Disposition Policy passed by the Common Council on April 4, 2023 via Resolution 66 of 2023, the City is to open a Request for Proposals process for any City-property commercial property and for any property with over \$30,000 in back taxes and fees.

The Office of Housing Initiatives opened a Request for Proposals process for a qualifying commercial property: 38 Post. The City has owned this vacant property for over 10 years.

Recently, an evaluation committee reviewed the application received for the property and selected Studio Jean Shin. Studio Jean Shin proposes to renovate and adaptively reuse the property as an arts studio, storage and exhibition space. I believe Studio Jean Shin is uniquely qualified to rehabilitate this property and bring it back to productive use and enthusiastically ask the Common Council to approve this property transfer.

Though Studio Jean Shin initially offered to pay \$48, 865.00 for the property, the applicant's request to the Council is to pay \$10,000.00 for the property. Due to the cost of the due diligence process, unknown environmental contamination issues, and a recently discovered easement on the property, I believe this reduction is well justified.

I request that the Common Council approve the transfer of 38 Post to Studio Jean Shin Inc. for \$10,000.00. I also ask that you allocate 10 minutes for Brian Ripel and Jean Shin from Studio Jean Shin Inc. to present their acquisition process to date and plans for the property upon acquisition.
