
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
•Overlapping districts: Historic, cultural and design •Four types of districts: Historic (4), Design (3), Heritage Area,

PLANNING BOARD FUNCTION and AUTHORITY

•Planning Board function and authority currently distributed in different sections of City Code and Zoning Law

•Create new section of Zoning Law, which consolidates all Planning Board duties

•Give Planning Staff power to approve small-scale actions to expedite review and relieve Planning Board of basically ministerial functions
