Department Functions:

The Department of Health and Wellness is charged with coordinating the Live Well Kingston Commission (LWK), implementing the Creating Healthy Schools and Communities (CHSC) grant project, and managing and supporting other projects that increase access to health in the City of Kingston. The department was created in 2018 with funding from a private foundation. In 2021, we received the CHSC grant, for 1.5 Million for 5 years, that fully pays for the new Project Manager's salary and benefits.

Coordinating the Live Well Kingston Commission includes the support of its six subcommittees: Age Well, Eat Well, Grow Well, Heal Well, Travel Well, and Play Well. These "Focus Teams" build coalitions with community, host events, and support projects. Along with coordination, the department is tasked with communicating about health, community projects, and LWK initiatives. This is done through social media, the LWK website, meeting notes, press releases, radio interviews, and networking.

The department has managed grant projects, expanded community connections, added capacity to ongoing City projects, implemented many Focus Team projects, and continued Live Well Kingston communications and outreach.

Highlights of 2021 Accomplishments:

- Managed Grant Projects
 - \circ $\;$ Applied for and won 3-years of department funding from a private foundation
 - Went into contract with a consultant to support the creation of the Pedestrian and Bicycle Master Plan
 Created a public outreach plan and is collecting input via surveys and a crowdsourcing app
 - Went into contract with the State DOH for the 5-year CHSC grant project
 - Hired a Project Manager for the CHSC grant
