In all, some one thousand-seven-hundred structures were cataloged; and this number included some of historical or architectural significance which might have fallen into slightly later periods than the 1850 benchmark which had been established.

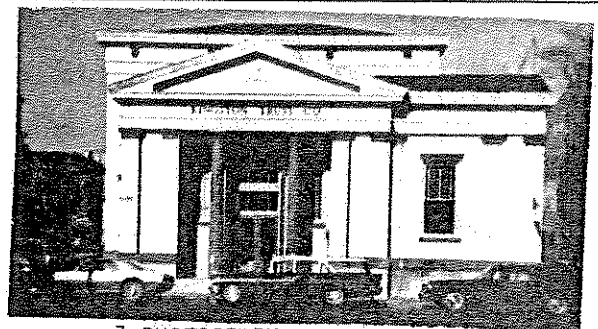
This building has eight rooms plus an attic, cellar and main floor. The main floor is of block construction. This was known originally as the "mens club". The building has been remodeled in the past few years.

<p>This congregation was established in 1659 with Dominie Blom as pastor. Dominie George Doll (1775-1808) was a fervent patriot who helped bring this area to the attention of General George Washington.</p> <p>This is the fourth church building occupied by this congregation and was erected in 1852. It was designed by Minard LeFevre, a much respected architect of that time. Calvert Vaux, an eminent architect, who was once called here to redesign the pulpit said that he could not change a thing without impairing the exquisite unity.</p> <p>Notable Features:</p> <p><u>Bell</u>-Purchased from Paulus Kuk of Amsterdam in 1794. Tradition says it was cast from molten silver and copper brought by people of area when they presented children for baptism.</p> <p><u>Washington Letter</u>-Framed original in museum room-Nov. 18, 1782.</p> <p><u>Seaman's Chest</u>-Dated February 1676, in museum room-depository for church records for many years.</p> <p>1891 Rev. Notable Features, Cont'd.:

120th Regiment Monument-in cemetery-presented by General George Sharpe in 1897 to survivors of the 120th regiment. Land actually deeded to the statue- only statue in country raised by a General to his men.

This two story building has three rooms, not including the entrance area. It has 29 windows, 18 inch window sills, 6-8 inch floor boards, 2 stairwells and original hardware and beams. Electricity has replaced the original gas lights and Bethany Hall has been added. It has no cellar, only an access space.

Two legends about the church involve the pranks of the "Dundenburg Gnome" and "the Sideways Gravestone" which was placed over the grave of a parishioner who chanced to fall asleep and tumbled off the balcony. He died of his injuries and was buried in the church yard opposite to the other graves to warn others not to repeat his mistake.

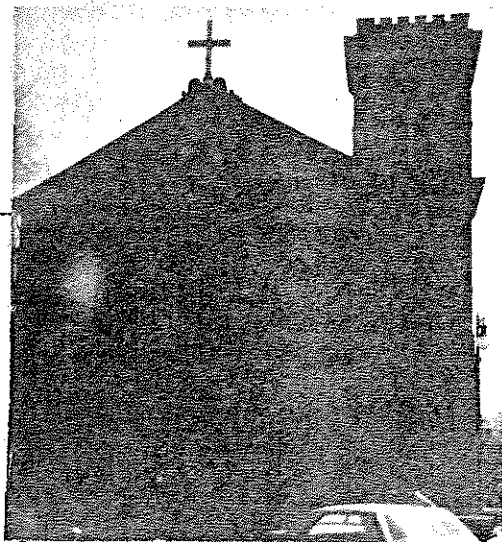

This building was first owned by the Dutch Church. In 1849, about 27 people left the Church and built the Dutch Reformed Church which is now the Fair St. Reformed Church. The church building then became an armory for a few years. In 1868, it became the St. Joseph's Roman Catholic Church.

At one time it was used as a hall and it was from here that the 120th regiment marched off to fight in the Civil War.







It is of field limestone construction with a brick addition in the rear built during the late 18th century. A stone addition has been built in recent years. The door, containing original glass bulls eyes, has been preserved and two ovens and a fireplace were left undisturbed when the interior was re-lined to create offices in 1959. The original 12 to 18 inch- wide floor boards have been placed in storage.</p> <p>Original log timber lintels are present in basement openings, and the main flooring beams show the original charring marks from the fire of 1777. In the attic the end gable clapboards had been replaced by bluestone in the post-Revolution reconstruction with the addition of two small windows in the eastern wall. The roof construction demonstrates expert trunnel work in the mortise and tenon as well as the half-lap log joints suggestive of early post-Revolutionary repair.</p> <p>The Ulster County Medical Society was founded by thirteen physicians and surgeons meeting in this building on Tuesday the 1st day of July 1806. In later years it was owned by John C. Wynkoop, a lawyer and subsequently by William Radcliff. By 1820, it was occupied by his widow Hannah Radcliff.</p>

4. NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION OPEN TO PUBLIC <p>This home was one of the first clapboard (brick lining) buildings erected within the Stockade area. It was built by Senator John Sudan as a townhouse. The Sudan family sold this property to the Van Leuvans in 1850; and it was occupied by them until 1938 when it was purchased by Mr. Johnston. A wing in the rear of this building was added on in 1809 and was used by Mr. Sudan as a law office and later as a political party headquarters.</p> <p>All the woodwork and hardware in this house is original, as well as a basement fireplace and crane and ovens; and one room in the basement has original bluestone-in-sand floor.</p> <p>There are 3 stairwells, 9 working fireplaces, 35 windows (some original panes), some wide floorboards, and the ceiling height is 10 feet and 2 inches.</p> <p>On the first floor there are 5 rooms and a reception hall, and the second floor has 4 rooms. The attic and basement have recently been divided into rooms. There are exposed beams in the attic floor.</p>

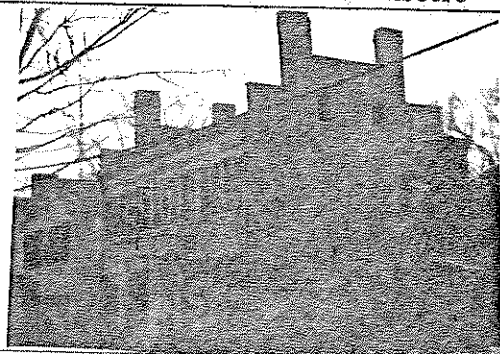

4. NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION OPEN TO PUBLIC <p>The homestead of Abraham Low was burned in the fire of 1776. Only the rear or kitchen part was rebuilt until Benjamin Ostrander erected the two story stone double house in front of and adjoining the part at the rear. After the completion of the building, he opened it as a hotel under the name "Kingston Coffee House" and was so kept by him until 1820. There is a legend that the man in the coffee house went across the street for grog and the man in the grog shop came over for coffee.</p> <p>The house is built of stone with a small part of frame in the rear. There is a porch upstairs and one side dormer upstairs. There are 12 rooms with ceilings between 9 and 10 feet. There are 2 fireplaces boarded up. Others are on the first and second floors and one in the cellar. The window sills are wide and the depth of the stone walls.</p>

<p>4. NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION OPEN TO PUBLIC</p> <p>This house stands on the N. W. corner of John and Crown Streets. It is known as the John and Katie Janssen house and was rebuilt after the revolution upon the site of the Matthew Janssen Homestead. The exact date of the reconstruction is unknown. One room in the present structure is said to be part of the original Janssen Homestead built about 1700. Still later, it was known as the Hardenburgh House.</p> <p>Notable features include the original front door and exposed beams in the basement, 1 bedroom and the room said to be part of the original Janssen Homestead. There are 2 stories plus a low rough attic, 7 rooms, 2 baths, halls and 2 stairwells. There is also an unfinished dirt floor basement under part of the house. An annex was built on in the early 1800's which includes 2 stories, an unfinished basement and is of stone construction. There are 5 working fireplaces and one covered many years ago. Most of the floor boards have been covered or replaced but there are some original wide boards in 2 rooms. The window sills are 12 inches wide and 20 small pane windows are to be seen.</p>

OPEN TO PUBLIC

The purchase of a house and lot on the southwest corner of John and Crown Streets was made on December 10, 1773 by the Trustees of Kingston. Here a school was started that made Kingston for many years the central point for education in the State. For a long period of time, no institution sustained a higher or more enviable reputation than Kingston Academy. The building was burned on October 16, 1777. The School was rebuilt from the remains of the stone and timbers in November of 1778.

Kingston Academy was the alma mater of a large proportion of the distinguished men of New York who lived in the latter part of the eighteenth century and in the nineteenth and early part of the twentieth, also. Some of these men were: General John Armstrong, writer of the celebrated Newburgh letters of Washington's day educated his children here; John Vanderlyn, the artist studied here; DeWitt Clinton; Marius Schoonmaker, noted historian; John and Philip Schuyler; Nicholas Roosevelt; Edward Livingston, who became President Jackson's Secretary of State; General George Sharpe; Judge Alphonse Clearwater; A. Bruyn Hasbrouck, afterwards president of Rutgers College and many, many more.

On June 23, 1915, Kingston Academy was closed, graduating that year the last class from the oldest academy in New York State, one that had existed for 141 years. The building has been occupied continuously since 1778 - it is presently occupied by the Stockade Restaurant and Radio Station WGHQ.

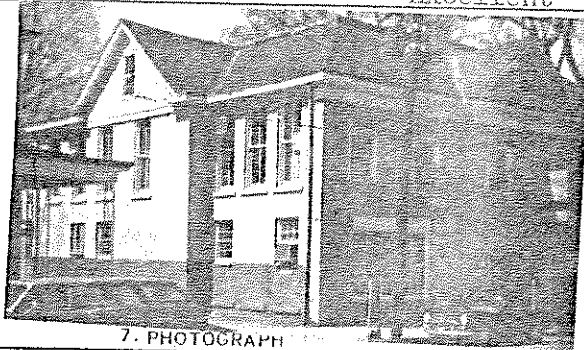





The present owners claim that there was a tunnel in the basement which was used during Indian raids to escape to the lowlands beyond Green Street. When they purchased the house 20 years ago, there was a large, deep hole in the dirt floor. A long, narrow closet occupies a space under the eaves just above the front entrance. It is reported to have been a hiding place for slaves being brought down from Canada.</p> <p>There are 9 rooms (1 is a small frame addition built about 150 years ago); 5 fireplaces (all original and working); 1 stairwell; exposed beams in all first floor rooms and in cellar; original floorboards covered by carpet; 18" window sills; step-down dining room; original front door etched glass; and the dormer just above the front entrance has interesting church-like windows.</p>

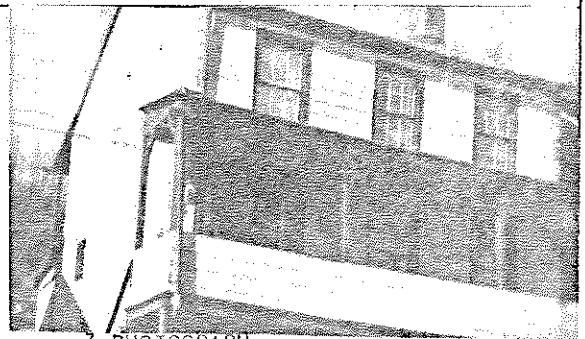

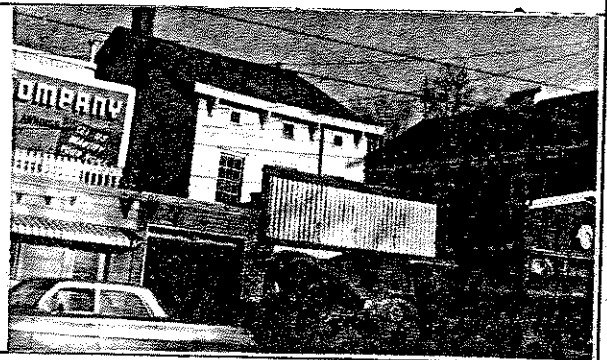
