Program Description

Program Details

This is an in-class educational program. An environmental educator will arrive at your school with all of the necessary programming materials a few minutes prior to the first program. If it is possible to set up a location for several programs to take place, for instance the library or art/music room, or one of the classrooms that would be ideal. If this is not possible, then the program could be moved from class to class.

Preparations: The programming room should have one large prep table for the educator's materials. The students can either be seated at desks or tables, or on a floor carpet. There will need to be a classroom blue recycling bin and a classroom garbage can in the room.
