Currently, 23.6% of the 986 housing units in the area are owner occupied; 62.0%, renter occupied; and 14.3% are vacant. Currently, in the U.S., 56.0% of the housing units in the area are owner occupied; 32.4% are renter occupied; and 11.6% are vacant. In 2010, there were 972 housing units in the area - 24.6% owner occupied, 61.7% renter occupied, and 13.7% vacant. The annual rate of change in housing units since 2010 is 0.64%. Median home value in the area is \$90,196, compared to a median home value of \$190,791 for the U.S. In five years, median value is projected to change by 3.42% annually to \$106,707.

2008-2012 ACS Estimate: The American Community Survey (ACS) replaces census sample data. Esri is releasing the 2008-2012 ACS estimates, five-year period data collected monthly from January 1, 2008 through December 31, 2012. Although the ACS includes many of the subjects previously covered by the decennial census sample, there are significant differences between the two surveys including fundamental differences in survey design and residency rules.

Margin of error (MOE): The MOE is a measure of the variability of the estimate due to sampling error.
